Preface

When our college team went to the First Baptist Church in Bentonville, Arkansas, we were pleasantly surprised by the presentation of the Gospel in dramatic form. Every sense was touched as we followed a demon into hell where we heard the pitiful testimonies of condemned souls standing or buried in what appeared to be hot beds of coals. Satan met us at the beginning and the end of our tour inviting us to stay with him. As we ascended a stairway, a cool breeze swept across my face, and I remember saying, "This is where I belong." At the top of the stairs, we stood at the foot of a large cross where the Gospel of salvation was presented to us by a preacher. We were then led into a bright, music-filled room of singing saints who each gave a testimony of how they were saved. After the program, I found out that many souls were saved as a result of this ministry, that hundreds of people were presented with the Gospel in just three nights, and that there were more people calling to reserve an appointment to go through the house than could be handled. I told our group that the only question in my mind was not if we would do such a ministry but when. The next year, we visited First Baptist again for ideas and advice. The following year, we began the ministry of the House of Destiny. This three day ministry alone has impacted almost a thousand people every year with one of the most powerful presentations of the Gospel I have ever seen. I am confident that once you see this presentation, you too will pray about and consider including this ministry as one of your annual evangelistic events. Because some of the scenes and scripts of our House of Destiny are different every year, the following represents the 1994 production. Undoubtedly, your group will make changes to incorporate their own ideas, adapt to your facilities, and to shorten or lengthen the production. We change our scripts every year to keep the presentation new and surprising for everyone.

Introduction

The House of Destiny is an alternative to haunted houses and recreational witchcraft that is popular during Halloween. It presents the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a powerful dramatic form and challenges each viewer to consider his or her eternal destiny. Unlike “hell house” ministries, the House of Destiny avoids shock effects and instead relies on the power of the Gospel message to save souls.

In the House of Destiny, eternally tormented souls in hell share their excuses for rejecting Jesus Christ. In the heavenly room, saints tell how their decision to give their life to Christ was the best thing they ever did. Most importantly, “in the way” from hell to heaven an agonizing lost soul discovers how to change the course of his destiny from the eternal fires of hell to the eternal, heavenly fellowship with Christ.

This ministry reaches hundreds of viewers within hours and results in salvation and rededicated lives. Its impact continues long after the October presentation. It is a ministry worth sponsoring in your own church.

Order of scenes in the House

1. **CHECK-IN.** Guests are welcomed, the number of people in each group is recorded, and literature is given to them. They receive a brochure on the House of Destiny and a Halloween Gospel tract.
2. **WAITING ROOM.** Guests watch evangelistic videos until their group is called to go through the House of Destiny.
3. **HALLWAY.** The group coordinator guides the group to the first scene of the House and explains the safety rules.
4. **DEATH ROOM.** The group hears an emergency call for doctors and nurses as they enter the first room to discover a flurry of activity around a hospital patient who is in critical condition. Suddenly, the heart monitor goes flat, attempts to revive him fail, the lights fade, and the doctors leave the room. A voice in the dark calls out the patient's name. The patient asks questions about what has happened and where he is. The Grim reaper introduces himself and leads the horrified and unwilling soul to hell. The group follows.
5. **HELL chambers.** Tormented souls explain their previous life and rejection of Christ.
6. **THE CROSS.** A lost soul is saved after hearing the Gospel message.
7. **THE GATES OF HEAVEN.** Saints share how they received the promise of Jesus Christ.
8. **DECISION ROOMS.** Counselors talk with individuals in the group about their personal decisions to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior.
9. **EXIT DOOR.** People are thanked for coming and are given a church brochure.
10. **FOLLOW-UP TEAMS.** Organized outreach teams continue to minister to those who request more information.

People, Props, and Scripts

Set-up crew

People

- Assign cast members responsibilities in their area of the set.

Props

- All materials and tools needed for set design.

Script

Director and set-up teams need to allow for plenty of time to finish the set and to obtain materials.

Check-in/waiting room

People

- Check in person and two helpers
- Video technician and crowd controller

Props

- Registration and sign-in sheet
- Gospel tracts and House of Destiny brochure
- Waiting room needs TV and VCR to show evangelistic program.

Script

- Take care of registration prior to performance.
- Greet people as they come.
- Ask them to sign the registration book.
- Explain that they will be called from the waiting room when it is their turn.
- Organize groups of twenty.
- Manage the video programs in the waiting room.

Hallway

People

- Four hall monitors

Props

- Walkie talkies

Script

- Need to guide groups from waiting room to death room, and give instructions.
- Tall people stand in the back.
- Be careful in the dark.
- No children under twelve years old without an adult.
- Stay with the group at all times.
- For an emergency, tell the group guide.
- Monitors should help manage crowd from beginning to end.

Death Room

People

- Doctors and nurses with medical equipment
- Patient
- Grim Reaper

Props

- TV, VCR, tape of heart monitor and heart beat
- Tray of medical instruments
- Table for patient

Scripts

1. Audience enters the room to find doctors and nurses frantically working on a patient.
2. The heart monitor is loud and visible when it goes flat line.
3. A doctor tries to shock the patient's heart into beating again but fails.
4. The light fades as the doctor says, "I'll go tell his wife."

5. A voice in the dark calls out the patient's name, and a faint red light turns on.
6. The patient responds confused and disoriented as the grim reaper explains what has happened.
7. The patient unwillingly yields to the command of the reaper to go, crying all the way.
8. The grim reaper tells the audience to follow.

Hell

People

- Three people per booth
- Two Satans
- Two grim reapers/demon guides

Props

- Booths (4' x 8') are constructed of PVC pipes painted black and draped with black fire resistant cloth.
- Heaters warm the air, and burnt matches add sulfur smell.
- Small styrofoam peanuts partially painted with red and orange fluorescent paint look like hot coals under black lights.
- Signs with Scripture quotes and phrases written with fluorescent paint are mounted on the cloth wall of the booth.
- Tape player is used to play moans and heart beat.
- Fresno lights are used on both Satans.
- An orange light and a fan blowing on white cloth produces the effect of flames.
- Actors dress appropriately for their character role.

Scripts

1. Keep the scripts simple and brief to make the point.
2. First Satan welcomes the group to hell.
3. First booth: Offenders such as alcoholic, drug abuser, sex offender, murderer, and abortionist
4. Second booth: Victims such as birth defect, child abuse, unbelieving parents, and poverty
5. Third booth: (Excuses such as no time, not interested, in pursuit of materialism and fame) - sports star, businessman, generation X, a mother

6. Fourth booth: False religion such as a “Christian” leader, Mormon, self-improvement guru, good grandmother

7. Fifth booth: Occult such as dungeons and dragons, ouji board, tarot cards, and Satan worshippers

8. The second Satan meets the group at booth five and assures them of their reservations for a return visit saying there will always be room for one more.

Some lines from hell scripts:

- The demon guide mocks the condemned souls with comments such as, “Don’t let him fool you, he’s having the time of his life.”

- Whatever happened to purgatory?

- This is not fair. I don’t deserve to be in hell. I did everything right, most of the time. I lived right. I didn’t drink or dance, I went to church, I tithed, I was a deacon, I witnessed. I don’t like it here. I want out!

- I knew I wasn’t good enough. That’s why I never bothered to ask Christ to save me. I just didn’t think He would ever save someone like me. But now, I know He wants to save everyone from the torments I’m feeling right now. I was deceived. Christ wanted to help because I couldn’t help myself. What a fool I was!

- It is my mother’s fault that I am here. She never told me about this place, and my father said that hell did not exist.

- First Satan in white

Welcome, welcome one and all; my friends, my followers, my children. Welcome to my world. It can be yours too. Don’t push, don’t shove, there’s plenty of room for all. Hell will enlarge itself to take all comers.

Look around and get to know each other. Life was short, but we’ll be here forever. Stop and see some of our early arrivals. They’ll tell you how they got here. Later you can tell us your story — how you got here!

Fiendish laugh.

- Preacher

Some of you look surprised to see me here. In fact, I think I remember seeing some of you when I was preaching. Well, you’re not as surprised as I am. When I stood before the throne of God and heard Him say that he never knew me Can you imagine how I felt? How would you feel if you spent most of your life teaching people about the Bible and doing your best to help others and then God says, “I never knew you.” I cried out saying, “But Lord, I

preached your Word to others, I sacrificed my life, comfort, and pleasures for others—for you.” But it was all in vain ... worthless ... a wasted life! I barely missed heaven. I read about God’s grace and taught others about it. But, I thought it meant living a good life by the grace of God. I was wrong ... wrong! Christ’s grace saves you when you repent of your sins and trust the good work of Christ not your own. Confess your need for Him and trust Him. Do not be deceived as I was. Trust Him to save you or He will never know you. Trust Him!

•Teacher

This isn’t right. Its not right! I devoted my life to improving the lives of children. I prepared them for success. I was honored as teacher of the year. I helped children, did good for others, and taught them about life and their world. How could I have missed the most important thing in life ... preparing for eternal life? I not only failed to see God in creation, I denied Him. I was wrong! Horribly wrong. Knowledge is not the key to life. Good knowledge is. Good decisions require good information. Listen carefully to those talking to you this evening. Listen students. Listen carefully and learn.

•Drunk teens

Teen 1: Fun and pleasure is all I wanted. My friend and I went out for a good time. That’s all. But, it turned out to the biggest mistake of my life.

Teen2: You blew it man. And I blew it following you!

Teen 1: We went for out for a cruise around the city after a couple of beers. No big deal. We were having fun. We were feeling good.

Teen 2: But, now ... agony, misery, and regret. A few moments of pleasure compared to eternity in the fires of hell is no pleasure man.

Teen 1: I was so stupid.

Teen 2: Yeah, stupid. And me ... a big jerk for hanging out with you.

Teen 1: What a mistake! I blew it!

Teen 2: Everyone in hell has. There is nothing in life worth dying in hell for.

•Second Satan

Lucifer beckons the group to stay saying, “Don’t go, all of your friends are here. This is where you belong. Live it up, you have plenty of time. Eat, drink, and be merry. I’ll be waiting for you.” He promises the world and every desire.

The Cross

People

- Angel
- Sinner
- Evangelist

Props

- A large wood cross and a white carpet runner leading to it.
- Red lights focused on the cross.
- Bright Christmas lights line the floor on both sides of walk way
- An angel dressed in a white robe and a gold cord holds an electric (battery) candle to lead the group from hell to the cross.

Scripts

Angel greets the group coming out of hell and explains that there are two destinies: eternal death and eternal life. Only those who have their names written in the Book of Life have eternal life—a relationship with God in heaven that will last forever.

Angel: Please gather in so I can see everyone. We want to make sure we have not left anyone in hell. What you have witnessed is the destiny of those who have rejected the gift of eternal life in Jesus Christ. Instead, they chose to wait a little longer before making a decision, thinking they had plenty of time. Others just wanted to do their own thing and disregarded God's Word. As you can see, this is very foolish.

If you are like most people, you are wondering what your destiny will be. There is a way to know. Your destiny can be found in the Book of Life. If your name is found in the Book of Life, heaven is your destiny. If your name is not found in the Book of Life, your destiny is hell. Follow me, and I will show you how your name gets into the Book of Life.

Sinner (coming from behind the group): Wait! Wait a minute. I need help. I've been like a lot of those people in there. I've said the same things, and I've lived the same way as some of them. I don't want to end up in hell. Tell me, what must I do to be saved?

Evangelist (also coming from behind the group): I see you carry a very great burden in your soul — realizing that you are separated from God because of sin, the many things that you've done wrong like: lying, cheating, stealing, and being selfish, mean, and hateful. Sin is a heavy burden, and condemnation for sin is a dreadful thought.

Sinner: I know I've done things that I shouldn't, but I've done my best. Isn't that good enough?

Evangelist: No. It is not.

Sinner: Oh, this is a heavy burden, and more than I can bear. If I died right now, I would go to hell.

Evangelist: Yes, you would. You are experiencing conviction. The Spirit of God is revealing to you that you are a sinner and separated from God. God is righteous and cannot stand to be in the presence of sin. He cannot tolerate sin or even look at it. He must put it away from Himself forever, completely and totally. God has placed a wide gulf between you and Himself, so you cannot bring your sin into heaven. There is absolutely nothing you can do about it. There is nothing you can do to help yourself.

Sinner: How do I get rid of such a burden? If it does not help to change my life, to go to church, or to give to the charities, then what must I do to be saved?

Evangelist: It is by the grace of God that you are saved. Only God can bridge the gap that separates you from God. Only He can help you. Only God can do what is necessary to save you from your sins. It is God's free gift to you.

Sinner: If there is nothing that I can do, then I beg of you, tell me, how do I receive His gift?

Evangelist: Turn away from your sins, and turn to Jesus Christ. For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. God has shown His love toward us, in that while we were sinners, Christ still died for us.

Sinner: Because of my sins, I deserve to go to hell, but Christ died for me so I wouldn't have to?

Evangelist: That's right. Give your life to Jesus Christ, and He will save you. He will bring you across the wide gulf that separates you from God. Whoever calls upon the name of the Lord, trusting and believing in Him, shall be saved!

Sinner: I want to believe. I want to give my life to Christ.

The sinner runs up to the cross and prays: Lord, I've sinned against you, and I am sorry. Forgive me, and take control of my life. I trust in you. Thank you. — (Looking at evangelist) He has saved me and taken away my sin!

Evangelist: Congratulations. Are you sure He has saved you?

Sinner: Yes!

Evangelist: You can be 100% confident that you will go to heaven only when you have 100% confidence in Christ to save you.

Sinner: I do. Does this mean that my name is written in the book of life?

Evangelist: Yes, it does.

Angel to crowd: What you have just witnessed is the beginning of the Christian life. Follow me, and I will show you the destiny of Christians in heaven. It is much better than those in hell.

Heaven

People

- Male angel
- Five saints

Props

- Misty fog from fog machine and dry ice
- Golden curtains of mylar draped over framing of booths.
- Air conditioned room to contrast with hell
- Large Book of Life with names in it
- White sheets on floor and walls
- Tape recorder with distant shouts of praise and music

Scripts

The group is greeted by a male angel at the entrance gates of heaven. As they enter the room, he asks them if their names are written in the Book of Life, which he holds in his hand. Several saints come to the gate to greet the group. The guiding angel explains to the group that they are getting a rare privilege to meet some of those in heaven and to find out how they came to be there.

1. Childhood testimony of salvation. "My friend, Jimmy McCloud, and I went to a meeting. I accepted. I hope my friend did." Is his name written in the book of life?

Male angel: No, it is not.

Everyone looks sad.

2. "I was wicked, (match with a hell testimony) but I accepted Christ three months before I died. I am so glad to be saved, but having perfect understanding of how things really are, I regret not becoming a Christian earlier. Life could have been so much better.

3. Testimony of a carnal Christian

4. Testimony of a faithful saint

5. Angel dismisses group and reminds them that they too can

go to heaven if they will turn their lives over to Jesus Christ, ask Him to forgive them of their sins, and trust in Him to save them.

As the audience descends the stairs to the counseling area, signs on the wall in the stairway asks, Is your name written in the Book of Life? Do you have eternal life?

Counselling rooms

People

- Three men and three women

Props

- Survey cards
- Gospel diagram
- Pencils

Scripts

The visitors are greeted by well dressed counsellors, divided into four groups, and asked to fill out surveys. A counsellor reviews a diagram of the Gospel posted on the wall and gives everyone an opportunity to pray and ask Christ for eternal life. The surveys are collected and given to the follow up team.

Exit door

People

- A door greeter

Props

- Church brochure
- Donation basket

Script

Thank everyone for coming, and hand them a brochure as they leave.

Follow-up teams

People

•Arrange to visit each person who requests more information within six days.

Props

- Bible
- Gospel tract
- Knowing God personally*, study guide
- Follow-up lessons for Spiritual Growth*, study guide
- Church Membership*, book
- Survey cards of those to be visited
- Follow-up instruction guide

Script

1. Sort surveys according to the requests made and prioritize. Requests for learning about how to be saved are top priority.
2. Write down names and phone numbers for record keeping.
2. Mail appropriate follow-up letters immediately.
3. Call people the next night, and set an appointment time.
4. Prepare to share your testimony of salvation and the Gospel.
5. Invite to a Bible study, church, and activities.
6. Leave appropriate literature, and arrange for next meeting.

Troubleshooters and monitors

People

Adequate number of men to monitor facilities from beginning to end.

Props

Walkie-talkies for each of the men

Script

Monitor the crowd, and be available to solve problems and needs as they arise.

Take down procedure

Take down set immediately after last performance while everyone is available. Host a pizza party after the take down.

Registration

Store registration book in marked box.

Waiting room

Return videos and TV equipment.

Death room

Fold cloth, and store with moth balls in marked boxes with props.

Hell Booths

1. Store p-nuts in bags and boxes.
2. Fold plastic and cloth together, then label.
3. Unscrew one pipe from each joint.
4. Wrap the four vertical pipes together.
5. Wrap the four horizontal side pipes together.
6. Wrap the four long edge pipes together.
7. Identify each set of pipes with booth number or color code.

Electrical and lighting equipment

Place black lights and extension cords in labelled boxes.

Costumes

Fold costumes, and store with moth balls in labelled boxes.

Heaven

Store costumes, curtains, and sheets with moth balls in labelled box.

Appendix

Special Makeup and Design

Charred skin in hell

Actors are made-up with charred skin of gelatin, cotton, latex, and fluorescent colored make-up. Actors dress to match their characters.

Grim Reapers and Spirit Guides

- Black flowing robes with hoods and black scrim over their faces.
- Sickle stick carried by grim reaper.

Satan

- First Satan is neatly dressed.
- Second Satan looks frightening and dressed in black.

Coals in hell chambers

•Use small styrofoam p-nuts. Partially spray them with fluorescent orange and red.

Survey card

What is your destiny?

Follow-up strategy

Why do follow-up?

Top priority follow-up contacts are those who want us to tell them how to be saved and those who are newly saved. These people need immediate follow-up. The desire to learn more about how to be saved will quickly diminish. The newly saved need to be strengthened and encouraged in follow-up training right away.

What has been done already?

Each person requesting more information has been sent a church brochure, a Gospel tract, and a letter telling them that you will be contacting them. They will be expecting your call. Please call right away to set up an appointment to meet them. This will show them that they are important and that what you have to share with them is important.

What should I do?

Obtain a response card with the name and phone number of someone requesting more information. Call that person, and tell them who you are and that you are responding to their request made during the House of Destiny. Remember, a smile on your end can be heard on their end.

Tell them that you want to give them a booklet and arrange to meet with them to answer their questions. Suggest a time to meet. If that is not a convenient time for them, suggest another time. Be prepared to suggest four or five different times that you could meet with them.

What booklet am I going to give them?

For those who want to know how to be saved, give them the booklet titled, "Knowing God Personally." This booklet presents the five A's of evangelism in study guide form. It can be taught as a lesson, or studied as a correspondence lesson. This study is a good way to begin the Bible Concepts.

For those who are newly saved, give them the booklet titled, "Follow up Lessons for Spiritual Growth." This study begins with assurance of salvation. During your first meeting review what they did to be saved, and share how they can be certain of their salvation.

For others, be prepared to tell them about Bible study opportunities in the church and about the ministries of the church. The Church Membership book has a lot of information in it that will answer many questions people have about our church.

Sample follow-up letter

Descriptions for Christian advertisement:

1. Not a haunted house or a hell house
2. House of Destiny glorifies God and exposes the folly and insanity of sin.
3. More than entertainment. It is a serious, sobering presentation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ that glorifies God.
4. In hell, no one has a valid excuse.
5. At the cross, a pilgrim is saved after being convicted and hearing the Gospel of Jesus Christ which delivers from death, hell, and the grave.
6. In Beulah Land, at the gates of heaven, the Book of Life is opened, and the blood washed, born again saints enter in the joyful presence of the Lord.
7. Use radio PSA's, TV video presentation of House of Destiny, church sign by street, brochure with credits, flyers, and newspaper ads.
